

Slea Paddlers Constitution and Rules.

1. Name.

The club shall be known as Slea Paddlers.

2. Objects.

The objects of the club are to promote the sport and recreation of canoeing.

3. Membership.

- i. **Qualification:** Any person who undertakes to behave in the best interest of canoeing shall be eligible for membership.
- ii. **Classes of Membership**
 - a) Full Members – over the age of 18
 - b) Family Members – the spouse and / or children under 16 (or 18 if in full time education) of a full member.
 - c) Junior Members – between the ages of 8 and 16 (or 18 if in full time education).
- iii. **Election:** Candidates for election to membership shall make written application to the Membership Secretary of the club on the form provided. The power of election shall rest ultimately with the general committee, who may refuse to elect to membership any applicant without assigning a reason for so doing.
- iv. **Restriction:** A person who has been expelled from, or refused membership of, the British Canoe Union, shall not be eligible for membership.
- v. **Acceptance:** The General Committee may at its sole discretion, decline to accept renewal of membership, from any person, without disclosing the reason.

4. Entrance Fee

Each applicant for membership shall, if his/her application be accepted, pay an entrance fee, the amount of which shall be determined by the members in General meeting.

Subscription

The rates of subscription shall be determined by the members in general meeting and shall be due on admission and, thereafter, annually on the anniversary of admission.

5. Cessation of Membership

- i. Any member may resign giving one month's clear notice in writing to the secretary.
- ii. Any member violating any of the rules or regulations of the club or being adjudged guilty of unsatisfactory conduct, may by resolution of the general committee, be suspended or expelled. Any member so suspended or expelled may appeal to a special general meeting if such an appeal is sponsored by not less than 80 per cent of members who are entitled to vote.
- iii. A member shall be deemed to have resigned from the club if, after due notice in writing, he/she has not paid the annual subscription within 4 weeks of it becoming due. He/she may, rejoin at any time during that year with payment of any entrance fee, subject to the provision of 3.iii or 3.v above.

6. Sections

- i. The club may organise various sections to cover the various activities of canoeing.
- ii. The affairs of each section can be conducted by a sub-committee of a minimum of 3 members of whom the chairperson or his/her deputy shall serve on the general committee.

7. Disqualification From Holding Office

- i. Only members entitled to vote are eligible to hold office, except that a junior section chairperson may be elected by the junior members of the club, and entitled to vote at general committee meetings.
- ii. Any member who under the age of 18 years, shall not be eligible, for election to the General Committee of the club.
- iii. Any member whose main income is derived from the sale or manufacture of canoes and/or accessories, or who is disqualified as an amateur under the rules of the British Canoe Union will not be eligible for election to the General Committee of the Club, but such a person may be co-opted without voting rights.

8. General Committee

- i. The General Committee shall conduct the affairs of the club as a whole and shall consist of a Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, and other officers as deemed necessary. Additionally, the General Committee may co-op members of the club to its number.
- ii. Nominations for the position of Chairperson, Hon Secretary, Hon Treasurer and other officers shall be put forward in the form of a motion under the terms of Rule 13.iv.
- iii. The general committee shall elect a Vice-Chairperson from among its number.
- iv. The term of office shall be for one year, and members shall be eligible for re-election.

9. Duties of the Committee

- i. **Chairperson:** The Chairperson will preside at all General meetings of the club and at all meetings of the General Committee. He / She shall be responsible for guiding the activities of the club in accordance with its rules and general policy as expressed by the majority of its members. The Chairperson shall represent or arrange for the representation of the club at BCU regional level and at meetings of other organisations. He / she shall ex officio be a member of any other committee of the club.
- ii. **Hon Secretary:** The Hon Secretary will be responsible for the organisation of meetings of the General Committee and of the club and the recording of minutes relating to such meetings and all correspondence relating to the particular activities of the section concerned at the earliest opportunity. The Hon Secretary will receive copies of the minutes relating to the meetings of section committees.
- iii. **Hon Treasurer:** The Hon Treasurer will be responsible for the collection of all monies including subscriptions and shall keep such books of account as required by the general meeting. He / she shall have the power to examine, after giving one week's notice, the books of any section, and shall report any discrepancies to the general committee. The Hon Treasurer shall audit the books of each section annually and shall produce at the AGM balance sheets showing the financial state of each section and of the general funds, accompanied by the Hon Auditors report. Cheques should have two signatures. The treasurer must make the committee aware of any existing or potential financial or cash flow problems.
- iv. **Duties of other Officers:** Officers may be elected to be responsible for the following duties.

- a) **Coaching Development Officer:** The Coaching Development officer will be responsible for members development as competent paddlers.
- b) **Membership Secretary:** The membership secretary will be responsible for membership.
- c) **Publicity Officer:** The publicity Officer will be responsible for publicising the club.
- d) **Section Chairperson:** Section Chairpersons shall be elected to oversee the affairs of section committees as may be appointed under article 6.ii.
- e) **Others as required.**

10. General Committees

- i. The General Committee is responsible for the general conduct of the clubs business and activities.
- ii. The General Committee shall meet at regular intervals during the year, as required by the business to be transacted.
- iii. Special meetings of the General Committee shall be called by the Hon Secretary on instructions from the Chairperson, or not less than 3 committee members.
- iv. Meetings of the section committees shall be called by the secretaries of the sections concerned, on instruction from the section Chairperson, or on the instructions of twenty percent of the members of the section committee.
- v. A quorum shall consist of not less than 3 members in the case of the General Committee, and not less than 3 members in the case of the Section Committee.
- vi. In the case of a casual vacancy among the General Committee, the said Committee shall appoint another eligible person to act until the next AGM.

11. Section Committees

- i) The Section Committees shall each consist of a maximum of 10 members elected by the section concerned, one of whom shall be the section captain and / or section secretary.
- ii) A Section Committee may nominate other members of the section to serve the Section Committee.

- iii) The Secretary to each section shall keep minutes of all section meetings and be prepared to produce these if required at General Committee meetings. He / She shall also be responsible for the collection of all monies relating to the section and shall submit a balance sheet showing the financial state of the section at the AGM. He / She shall also be prepared at all General Committee meetings to give a statement of the section's finances.
- iv) Section Committees may draw up rules and regulations necessary for the efficient management of the section, but such rules and regulations shall not become operative until approved by the General Committee.
- v) Section Committees shall meet at such intervals as are required to satisfactorily conduct the business of the section, or upon a demand signed by not less than twenty percent of the members of the section committee.

12. General Meetings

- i) An Annual General Meeting shall be held in November of each year. There shall be laid before the meeting a statement of accounts made up to the last day of the month of October.
- ii) An Extraordinary General Meeting shall be called on the instructions of a simple majority of the General Committee, or on a requisition signed by not less than 8 percent of the members of the club entitled to vote.
- iii) Not less than 21 days clear notice shall be given, specifying to all members the time and business of the General Meeting.
- iv) Motions for discussion at the Annual General Meetings, not of origin from within the General Committee, shall be lodged with the Hon Secretary at least 30 days preceding the AGM, and signed by 2 members entitled to vote.
- v) At any General Meeting, a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided by a show of hands, of those entitled to vote, except when more than one nomination has been received for a position on the General Committee, in which case voting will be by secret ballot.
- vi) At all General Meetings the Chairperson will preside or, in his / her absence, a Chairperson for the meeting will be elected by the voting members present.
- vii) Accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to, or the non-receipt of a notice of a meeting by any member shall not invalidate the proceedings of a meeting.

13. Liability

- i) The General Committee shall manage the affairs of the Club. Financial or legal liability incurred in the rightful exercise of their office shall not, however, be the personal liability of the Committee, but shall be the responsibility of the club as a whole.
- ii) All members or other persons who attend club tours or meets do so at their own risk, and neither the club nor its officers can accept any liability for any loss or injury of any kind sustained at headquarters or whilst on a club tour, meet or other activity.

14. Voting

Only full members, and family members over the age of 18 years are entitled to vote at all meetings

15. Alteration of Constitution

- i) This constitution shall not be altered, amended, or rescinded except by a General Meeting of the club.
- ii) A resolution to give effect to a change must be passed by at least 75 percent of the members present at the General Meeting and voting on this behalf.

16. Auditor

Every Annual General Meeting shall appoint a competent person (not associated with the club) to act as an Hon Auditor who shall at least once in every year, examine the accounts of the club, and ascertain the correctness of the income and expenditure accounts and of the balance sheet.

17. Distribution of profits

In no circumstances can any profit be distributed to members, but any profits earned shall be contributed to a General Fund for furthering the objects of the club.

18. Termination

The Club shall not terminate except by a resolution of a special General meeting convened for the purpose and, in such an event any surplus assets shall be handed

over to any group, club or charity with a formal written constitution agreed by the meeting which formally terminated the club.

19. Interpretation

Any matter not provided for in this constitution, or any questions over the interpretation of it shall be dealt with by the General Committee whose decision shall be final.

20. Rules





The General Committee shall be empowered to draw up rules for the safe conduct of canoeing activities, to include the following:

- i) No member may take a boat from the store, unless a responsible adult is present.
- ii) All members and visitors must wear buoyancy aids whilst on the water.
All members and visitors under the age of 18 must wear helmets. Members and visitors over the age of 18 can choose whether to wear a helmet, unless directed to wear a helmet by a coach.
All members and visitors actively carrying out safety duties must wear a buoyancy aid and helmet.
- iii) Juniors may not paddle without a competent adult present.
- iv) All members must be able to swim at least 50 metres in full clothing

21. Declaration

Each member upon joining shall sign an application whose format has been agreed by the General Committee.
